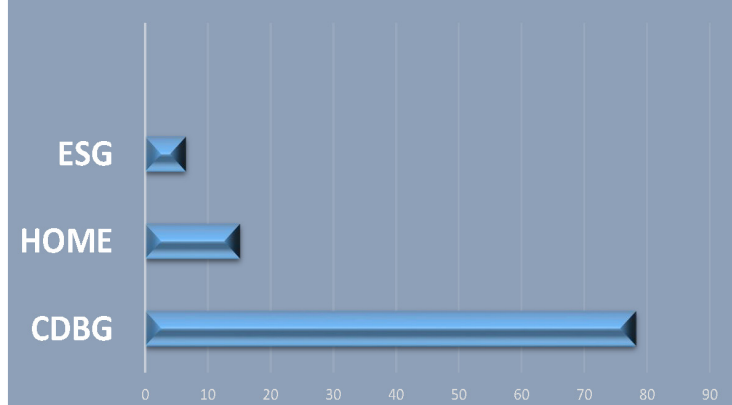
NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Program Compliance/ HUD Requirements

Minimum of 70% of Funding must benefit Low and Moderate Income populations - City is at 84.81%

Program cannot expend more than 15% of its annual allocation on public service projects- City is at 9.31%

Program cannot expend more than 20% of its annual allocation on planning & administration- City is at 16.14%

Expenditure standard: Program cannot have more than 1.5 times its annual allocation on its line of credit on February 1st - On January 1st, 2018 the City was at 1.48.



The Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report, or CAPER, summarizes the City's accomplishments achieved through the use of the entitlement funds allocated from the U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

The City of Canton is an entitlement jurisdiction that receives federal funds from United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to support local community development and affordable housing activities.

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) fund is used to fund a variety of programs benefiting low and moderate-income residents ranging from infrastructure improvements to homeowner rehabilitation programs, public services and fair housing initiatives.

The HOME program funds are used to provide loans and grants, to owners of rental property and to nonprofit community housing development organizations for acquisition, rehabilitation and the construction of affordable housing units.

The Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds are generally used for essential services related to emergency shelter, operation of emergency shelters, and homelessness prevention services.
