1.0 SCOPE AND CLASSIFICATION

- 1.1 **Scope:** The City of Canton, Water Department, is seeking the immediate purchase of one (1) Valve Operating Maintenance Trailer System. The trailer system will be delivered, upon execution of the contract, to the Canton Service Center, Department of Motor Vehicles.
- 1.2 **Classification:** This trailer system will be used to haul equipment and tools for the operating and maintenance of water valves on City streets, unimproved roads and alleys, and at times, on road conditions that are extremely rough. Therefore, special attention shall be given to heavy duty, rugged-type construction.

2.0 APPLICABLE PUBLICATIONS & STANDARDS

3.0 REQUIREMENTS

3.1 General Requirements

- 3.1.1 **Price:** All bidders are requested to bid fixed, firm pricing in the spaces provided on page 5A.
- 3.1.2 **Quality:** All bids must meet the minimum specifications listed below. The Trailer System shall be of a sturdy construction and be capable of withstanding the strains of services, as described in the Classification section above. All equipment not specifically mentioned, which is normally furnished by the successful bidder, shall conform in strength, quality of material and workmanship, as to what is provided in the automotive industry in general. A complete set of specifications must be submitted with your bid.
- 3.2 **Specification Requirements:** One (1) Valve Operating Maintenance Trailer System. 2013 or newer model required. Trailer shall include all of the following minimum requirements:

3.2.1 Valve Exercising Equipment

- 3.2.1.1 Equipment shall have articulating arm, automated valve operator with controlling torque, directions and turns, twin arms (one telescoping) should provide 13' or longer reach over 270 degrees of freedom while hydraulic disk brakes secure exerciser capable of 750' lbs or more of torque. Equipment shall be constructed of 3" or more square steel tube and powder coated. Valve key to be provided.

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- 3.2.1.2 Equipment shall also include standard duty, slide style, truck mount valve exerciser with automated controlling torque, direction and turns and center turntable bearing mount combined with stainless steel roller/clamp ring that provides 100 degrees of freedom and 27" or more head extension while safely securing exerciser capable of 1,500' lbs or more of torque. Shall provide at least an 8' long valve key with 2" universal socket.
- 3.2.1.3 Equipment must utilize automated technology to turn valves using AWWA recommended procedures. This technology shall provide "hands off" automation while exercising and protecting the valve by not assuming size, direction or current position. It shall allow the machine to follow the path of least resistance with programming and sensors to automatically stop the rotation and reverse in half turn increments as to flush calcification from valve gate. This allows the valve to be exercised at the minimum torque required to turn, then automatically lowers the preset threshold once rotation begins.
- 3.2.1.4 Equipment must include a PDA style handheld controller to operate and collect data for valve exercisers. Controller must be rugged with bright touch screen and water resistant.
- 3.2.1.5 Equipment shall include a software package which enables full data logging and synchronization between the handheld and a desktop GIS, allowing importing of existing data labels and categories with user defined fields.
- 3.2.2 Power Pack
- 3.2.2.1 Engine shall be a Caterpillar/Perkins 29 hp, liquid cooled diesel engine or equivalent.
- 3.2.2.2 Controls shall include digital tachometer, engine hour meter, volt meter, vacuum gauge, spoils dump switch, spoils door switch, water/vacuum selector switch, arrow board control and service light switch.
- 3.2.2.3 Vacuum pump shall be clutch operated, dual belt drive, positive displacement rotary lobe (roots type) blower. Vacuum performance of at least 500 CFM @ 11 inches of Hg to produce a conveying velocity rating of 10,185 FPM through 3" hose.
- 3.2.2.4 Pressure washer pump shall be clutch operated, dual belt drive, 2.5 GPM @3,000 PSI pump. Pump shall have a 7 gallon antifreeze tank with two position selector valve.
- 3.2.2.5 Hydraulic system shall have a direct coupled pump rated at 8 GMP @1,800 PSI continuous duty and a 10 gallon hydraulic reservoir with thermostatic controlled fan cooled heat exchanger. Instrumentation shall include an oil

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level gauge, temperature gauge, pressure gauge and selector valve switching to a HTMA class II auxiliary hydraulic circuit.

- 3.2.3 Spoils – Curb Side Discharge (pump specifications in the Power Pack section above – 3.2.2)
 - 3.2.3.1 Debris holding tank shall be at least 250 gallon holding capacity. Shall have top hinged full opening dump door with twin hydraulic remote operation door latches, sure seal square gasket, vacuum break valve, 6” mechanical ball shut-off and 3” dump valve.
 - 3.2.3.2 Filtration shall be staged consisting of heavy material drop out debris tank and self-contained multi- staged filter canister with a 10 micron polyester reusable cartridge. All filters shall be washable and reusable.
 - 3.2.3.3 Dumping shall have twin cylinders, electric over hydraulic dump system powered by Monarch HPU or equal. A slide and tip system shall move the tank out before tilting to clear the truck/trailer bed for dumping and then lift to 55 degrees to drop debris.
 - 3.2.3.4 Shall include a 3” x 20’ or larger suction hose with 2-1/2” x 8’, 1-1/4” x 8’ and 7/8” x 8’ steel suction wands.
- 3.2.4 Pressure Washer (pump specifications in the Power Pack section above – 3.2.2)
 - 3.2.4.1 Water holding tank shall be at least 66 gallon clean water holding tank with 8” fill neck.
 - 3.2.4.2 Shall include a 50’ or larger hose on spring rewind hose reel with quick disconnects to change between wands. Shall include one wand with a zero degree nozzle for digging and one wand with a 45 degree nozzle for fan wash.
- 3.2.5 Trailer
 - 3.2.5.1 Trailer frame shall be a minimum of 7,000 lbs GVWR with single axle and independent torsion wheel suspension with electric brakes. Shall be constructed of structural steel (no tubing) with metal deck. Tongue weight shall be at least 850 lbs dry.
 - 3.2.5.2 Trailer lighting shall be DOT approved LED lighting with Weather Pack environmentally sealed connectors.
 - 3.2.5.3 The entire trailer shall be solvent washed and phosphoric etched. All seams are to be caulked and a two part urethane black paint applied. A durable plastic bed lining shall be applied to trailer deck and fender fronts.

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- 3.2.5.4 A pintle hitch with safety chains shall be installed.
 - 3.2.5.5 A heavy duty, locking, polished diamond plate job box shall be installed.
 - 3.2.5.6 A programmable arrow board including an eight function control box with eight individual segments and two mounted halogen swiveling work lights shall be installed.
 - 3.2.5.7 A 50' spring rewind hose reel for auxiliary hydraulic power with quick disconnects shall be included.
- 3.3 Additional Requirements: The equipment is to be completely installed and adjustments made which are required to prepare the equipment for immediate and continuous operation upon delivery.

4.0 SAMPLING, INSPECTION, AND TEST PROCEDURES

- 4.1 Upon delivery, the trailer system shall undergo a thorough physical inspection by the City. If the trailer is damaged, defective, or substandard it shall be removed by the supplier and replaced at no cost to the City of Canton. In addition, if the delivered trailer does not conform to these specifications, it will be the responsibility of the dealer or manufacturer to comply with the requirements. Any extra accessories delivered on the vehicle that were not part of this bid will not be paid for.

6.0 NOTES

- 6.1 Warranty: Manufacturer's warranty to apply. The successful bidder shall furnish, with the equipment, the Manufacturer's Owner Service Policy. Terms of warranty shall be

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submitted with the bid, including any extension of warranty covering defects and adjustments not normally covered by the manufacturer's warranty. Warranty work will be performed by the dealership selling the vehicle. Warranty period will start on the date that the vehicle is put into service. Use of parts other than original equipment parts will not void warranty.

- 6.2 Proposal Page Instructions: Bidders are required to fill out Page 10 completely. Price shall include all of the requirements listed in the specifications. Also, bidders are required to fill in the blanks on 5A with the actual information for the truck that is being proposed.

The following standard indemnity agreement and minimum insurance requirements are incorporated in the Specifications for all work performed by the Contractor for the Owner, its affiliated and associated organizations or subsidiaries, hereinafter referred to as Owner.

- I. The Contractor agrees to indemnify and save the Owner harmless from and against any and all costs, loss and expense, liability damages, or claims for damages, including cost for defending any action, on account of any injury to persons (including death) or damage to or destruction of property of the Owner, arising or resulting from the work provided for or performed, or from any act, omission, or negligence of the Contractor, Subcontractor and his or their agents or employees. The foregoing provisions shall in no way be deemed released, waived or modified in any respect by reason of any insurance or surety provided by the Contractor.

- II. The Contractor shall maintain liability insurance and furnish the Service Director with Certificates of Insurance as evidence thereof in the prescribed form. If any work provided for or to be performed under any Specifications is sublet (as otherwise permitted by the terms of such Specifications), the Contractor shall require the sub-contractors to maintain and furnish him with satisfactory evidence of Workmen's Compensation, Employer's Liability and such other forms and amounts of insurance which Contractor deems reasonably adequate.

- III. In accordance with Item II, the Contractor shall maintain the following insurance:

A copy of the foregoing policy shall be filed with the Director of Public Service.

GENERAL CONDITIONS/CANTON INCOME TAX

Each bidder, by the act of submitting its bid agrees to withhold all City Income Taxes due Or payable under Chapter 181 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Canton for wages, salaries, fees and commissions paid to its employees and further agrees that any of its subcontractors shall be required to agree to withhold any such City Income Taxes due for service performed under this contract.

Furthermore, any person, firm, or agency that has a contract, or agreement with the City shall be subject to the City Income Tax whether the work being done is in the City or out of the City. In addition to the tax withheld for employees, the net profit on the contract shall be subject to City Income Tax.

Questions regarding this matter shall be directed to the City of Canton, Income Tax Department at 330-430-7900.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

Bidders shall take notice that they are to comply with the Codified Ordinances of the City of Canton, including but not limited, to the following:

1. Section 105.03 – U.S. steel usage required; exception.

All City contracts shall stipulate or provide that all steel necessary in the construction of any work performed under such contracts shall be steel that is produced in the United States unless a specific product which is required is not produced by manufacturers in the United States in which event this prohibition does not apply. This section shall apply to only contracts awarded by the Board of Control of the City. (Ord. 224-77. Passed 6-27-77.)

2. Section 105.05 – Materials to be purchased locally.

In all future contracts for the construction of buildings, structures, or other improvements under the Capital Improvement Budget, the following clause shall be printed or typewritten on each contract:

It is the desire of the City of Canton that all materials used in the construction covered by this contract shall be purchased in the Canton area except such materials which are unavailable in the Canton area. (Res. 49-77. Passed 2-7-77.)

3. Section 105.06 – Minority Contract Provision

(a) All contracts with the City shall include the following clause:

The bidder agrees to expend at least \$_____ of the Contract in the event the contract is awarded to such bidder for minority/women's business enterprises. For purposes of this pledge, the term "minority/women's business enterprise" means a bona fide business established as a sole proprietorship, partnership or corporation owned, operated and controlled by one or more minority persons or women who have at least fifty-one percent (51%) ownership. "Minority" includes African Americans, Asian/Pacific Islanders, Hispanic/Latino Americans and Native American Indians. The minority or woman must have operational and managerial control, interest in capital, and earnings commensurate with the percentage of ownership. Minority/women's business enterprises may be employed as construction contractors, subcontractors, vendors or suppliers. (Ord. 185-2011. Passed 10-31-11.)

4. Section 105.12 – Local preference.

(a) The Board of Control, in determining the lowest and best bidder in the award of contracts, is authorized to award contracts to local bidders. Local bidder as hereinafter defined, whose bid is not more than ten percent (10%) higher, subject to a maximum amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00), than the lowest dollar bid submitted by non-local bidders, provided that the project bid does not exceed ten percent (10%) of the engineer's estimate. The Board of Control's decision in making such an award shall be final. (Ord. 86-2009. Passed 5-18-09.)

(b) For purposes of this section, "local bidder" means an individual or business entity which at the time of the award of the contract:

(1) Is a resident of the City and/or has its principal place of business in the City; and

(2) Has filed a City of Canton "Resident" Income Tax Return for the past two tax years.

(c) All contract specifications and/or bid documents that are distributed by Canton for the purpose of soliciting bids for goods and/or services shall contain the following notice:

Prospective bidders will take notice that the City of Canton, in determining the lowest and best bidder in the award of this contract, may award a local bidder preference to any qualified bidder pursuant to Section 105.12 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Canton. Board of Control determines if a bidder qualifies for the local preference. The Board's decision shall be final. The City will a copy of City Code Section 105.12 is attached. (Ord. 112-97. Passed 6-2-97.)

d) This section shall be applicable to all contracts for the purchase of material, equipment, supplies or services, which are purchased, leased or constructed at a cost in excess of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) and which require bidding pursuant to Ohio R.C. 735.05 through 735.09 and Ohio R.C. 737.03.
