## BOARD MINUTES

MAY, 2006

The Canton Board of Park Commissioners met in regular session on Wednesday, May 3, 2006, at the Garden Center Building.

Present were: Mr. Andy Black, President; Ms. Marilyn Thomas Jones, Member; and Mr. Douglas V. Perry, Director/Secretary.

The meeting was called to order at 4:09 p.m.

At this time a motion was made by A. Black to approve the minutes of the April 5, 2006 regular meeting as written. A second was made by M. Thomas Jones, and the motion passed by unanimous vote.

Mr. Steve Lamiell, Vice President, arrived at the meeting at this time.

### NEW BUSINESS:

1. Canton Joint Recreation District requesting the use of the Garden Center Building on February 16, 2007 and April 5, 2007 to hold their Valentines & Easter Dances
2. Tri-County Aids Coalition requesting to use Stadium Park and Shelter 5 on September 10, 2006, to hold their annual walk and bake sale
3. Canton Jaycees requesting the use of picnic tables for Summerfest program downtown this year

The Board considered the first three of the above at one time.

A motion was then made by A. Black to approve use request 1 & 2 and to turn down the request for tables in Issue 3. A second was made by M. Thomas Jones, and the motion passed.

4. "Non-Disturbance and Estoppel Agreement" between the Ohio Cultural Facilities Commission, the National Football Museum, Inc., and the City of Canton - The Director explained that this was due to a grant the HOF was to receive to build an area at the hall. In order to receive the grant, the landlord has to agree that it is not a problem.

A motion was made by A. Black to endorse such an agreement. A second was made by S. Lamiell, and the motion passed by unanimous vote.

OTHER BUSINESS:

1. Pregnancy Support Center requesting to use Stadium Park and Shelter 5 on Saturday, September 23, 2006, to hold their annual "Walk for Life" fund raiser.


A motion was made by A. Black to approve this request with an insurance requirement. A second was made by M. T. Jones, and the motion passed by unanimous vote.

2. The Director informed the Board that vandalism and damage was up this spring throughout the parks.


Some serious vandalism at Harmont Park ran around nine hundred dollars in time, equipment and supplies to correct.
